The Usual Insurance Rant

"Proposed auto insurance plan just doesn't add up" was the heading in an article from May 23/25. The Alberta government has promised to significantly increase the compensation paid to individuals injured in automobile while simultaneously reducing premiums by 20%, this is their Care First scheduled to be in place in 2027. This plan is a 'no fault' system that promises two things, 1. that every party whether at fault or not will receive the same level of compensation and 2. your premiums will go down on average \$400, But the math doesn't add up as now both parties get paid out, where as in the fault based system the total compensation paid to injurers was only 15% of that paid to the victims, In this 'better system' the number of injurers will be the same as the victims, the premiums will have to increase by \$600, that's a difference of \$1000, as Jim Prentiss said to Rachel Notley during a leaders debate in 2014 "let me explain to you the math is hard".

And how would the government pull off saving us that \$400? By having the victims receiving compensation without going through the court system (less lawyers would be a good thing), but they will also be reducing the payout to those involved in accidents by possibly 50%. Given examples from other provinces that have gone this route, much of the reduction in compensation will come from significant restrictions on the amount paid to motorists who have suffered major physical injuries.

Is this system what Albertans want or understand? I sure would like the government to come clean/clear on how Care First will work and show us your math too.

And in the meantime, the government has capped the automobile rate increases this year to 7% (mine went up 7.3%) as the excuse was the increased claims costs to the industry, funny, the Auto Insurance rate Board released their report in January revealing that claims costs are dropping.
