CN Pension Committee / CN Pension Fund Update

November 2023

I. The CN Pension Committee met in person for the first time in 4 years on November 22. With the full committee and alternates attending, there was considerable discussion and lively interaction on the various topics and issues. The Committee reviewed and approved the most recent retirements and discussed some unusual cases. We also received a financial UPDATE from the CN Investment Division (CNID). Below are the highlights of the meeting and updates.

Indexation – (for those eligible) we approved the communications pensioners will receive explaining their 2024 indexation. The Canadian inflation rate last year was 6.8%, however the CN Pension Plan only allows for 50% of inflation for the previous year UP TO a maximum of 6% – so a 3% increase. Additionally the 3% increase is only applied to the first \$3250 of your monthly pension. So the maximum increase you can receive January 3I, is \$97.50 (\$3250 x 3%) and a minimum of \$9.00 (\$4.50 for spouses). A letter explaining this will be included with the January pension statement. We are also monitoring the health of the Plan Escalation Account which is used to pay for these indexation increases. It is tied to the investment gains (and losses) in the Plan and its value has dropped the last couple years.

CNPA Health Care Committee

The CNPA Health Care Committee representatives met in Montreal at the end of September to review the 2022-2023 budget, discuss 2024 premium rate changes, review issues related to the Plan administration, anticipated future cost pressures and also the latest aspects of Blue Cross drug management programs.

Premium Rate changes - Every fall your volunteer CNPA Health Care Committee meets to review the previous year's Health Care Plan financial results. Like your personal expenditures this past year, drug costs (particularly new high-cost drugs), rose by about 6%. Prescription drugs make up about 82% of all our Plan costs and those individuals who claimed over \$10,000 each increased 10% to 177.

Plan Provision changes-. In 2024, there will be an increase to the amount you can claim for annual eye examinations and also for foot orthodoxes and ambulances. We also adjusted the amount you can claim for Registered Nurses in your home and have also added Acupuncturists and Occupational Therapists as eligible specialists.

NEW Design for our Brochure-while the actual content of the Plan Brochure remains essentially the same (with the exception of the above changes) - we did a complete REVAMP of the entire brochure to make it easier to navigate, more visually appealing and hopefully for you, made some of the technical and administrative terms easier to read and follow. Please go to the website www.cnpensioners.org and click on Healthcare then click on MANUAL. Work Related Injuries or Illnesses-many of our fellow railroaders were afflicted while at CN, by physical injuries, exposure to noise, chemicals, etc. which may not have become evident until well beyond retirement. While any or all of these issues may not be eligible for some sort of post retirement claim, your doctor, or specialist may have an opinion that they may be linked to your former employment.

OTTAWA — The Ontario government is investing an additional \$15 million this year through the Local Priorities Fund to invest a total of \$35 million in 2023-24, to help long-term care homes support residents with complex needs like dementia and bariatric care. The funding will ensure residents can connect to the right care in the right place and help reduce avoidable emergency department visits and hospital stays.

Launched in 2022, the Local Priorities Fund invested \$20 million in 2022-23 to help long-term care homes purchase specialized equipment and train staff to provide more specialized care, so that more homes can welcome residents who have complex needs but no longer require acute care in hospital. The fund also helped current residents avoid hospital admissions who have new, or increasingly complex medical or specialized equipment needs which could not be previously accommodated in their long-term care home.

Some examples of the 173 successful projects invested in last year include:

- 15 long-term care homes in central Ontario purchased bladder scanners to quickly assess and treat residents, avoiding unnecessary trips to the hospital
- In Toronto, \$1.3 million was used to create four new nurse-led outreach teams and expand three existing teams to provide staff training and time-sensitive medical supports to help reduce avoidable emergency department transfers
- A \$1.7 million investment in Royal Ottawa Place to hire specially trained staff that can connect residents to mental health and behavioural care
- In the North East and North West regions, close to \$3 million supported a range of projects, including training staff on dementia, wound care, and how to use specialized equipment such as bariatric lifts and bladder scanners. Long-term care residents also received support from a speech language pathologist, personal support workers and a Cree translator/interpreter.

Breaking News! - NEW Canada Dental Care Plan

In December, the Canadian Government outlined senior's eligibility for the Canada Dental Care Plan. It will be phased in and by mid-year 2024 most Canadians over 65 may be eligible to receive treatment and coverage under the Plan.

You need to review the provisions, eligibility, timing and HOW & WHEN to apply Online at the GC website https://www.canada.ca/en/services/benefits/dental/dental-care-plan.html.

You should receive a Government letter when you are age eligible to apply. When you receive the letter:

- Follow the instructions in the letter to apply by phone.
- 2. Wait to receive a confirmation from Service Canada that lets you know whether your application was successful and you qualify for the CDCP.
- 3. If you do qualify, wait to receive your welcome package from Sun Life before scheduling any dental appointments. It will explain further when you can start to get care paid for and how.
