MMRC Regional Zoom Meeting May 5, 2023

Brian was our Representative on this call. 1) discussed and recognized the extensive contribution Butch Whiteman made to this committee, service to the CNPA, Pension Committee and all our members. The Region approved a \$100 donation to a family-suggested Cancer charity. 2) recognized Bruce Peacock, past National Treasurer/Membership Chair, after stepping back after 20+ years supporting the CNPA. The Region approved the gift of a jacket with the CNPA Mountain Region logo. 3) distribution of CN Partnership money will be based on a per capita split in 2023 and potentially an equal split in 2024. 4) Regional finances remain in decent shape. Etransfers for payments will be utilized again this year. 5) National positions up for election - Director (Al Vodden will stand again), Alternate Director (Gordon Wheatley may stand again), HealthCare Committee Representative (Blake Olson will stand again), HealthCare Committee Alternate, Pension Committee Alternate (Mary McLaughlin resigned). 6) Regional Council executive elected for a 2-year term in 2022 so, with no changes, it remains the same. 7) Scholarship Committee and Communications has a new Chair, Mike Englehart, and a new evaluator, John Wiebe. The deadline for 2023 applications is August 15, 2023. 8) New National website and new National Constitution & Bylaws are available for perusal, and everyone is encouraged to look into them. 9) Darlene Cherry, former head of CN Pension & Benefits Administration, has retired after close to 40 years of service, assisting pensioners with any problems they might have and working with the CNPA. We wish her well in her retirement.

2023 Regional Elections

Resumé forms at https://cnpamountainregion.wixsite.com/cnpa -mountain-region/documents-and-links. Only DB Pensioners and contributing CNPA members can apply. Call for applications is from May 1 to September 30. Submit documents to the Regional Chair, Dennis Jensen, and Regional Secretary, Blake Olson, by September 30, 2023. October 1 the Regional Secretary will provide the complete list of candidates for each position to each Regional Representative (for E2, it's the President). Before November 1st the E2 President will submit one ballot (for the local) for each available position to the designated Regional Representatives. Those ballots will be tabulated, and the Regional Secretary and Regional Chair will be notified of the results by November 10, 2023. (Note that E2 members will discuss and vote for the applicant of their choice, majority rules apply. Only the President will submit the final choice(s).) **Positions** available: Alternate Pension Committee Representative, CNPA National Director, Alternate National Director, HealthCare Committee Representative and Alternate HealthCare Committee Representative.
