Rail Safety Tips

1 Speed mis perception

Because of their size, trains appear to be much farther away and traveling much slower than their actual speed. Don't be fooled!

2 Trains can't stop quickly

The average train needs at least 2 km to stop. Trains can stop, but they can't stop quickly!

3 Trespassing

Taking a shortcut across the tracks or being on railway property is illegal, and trespassers can be seriously injured or killed.

4 Weight ratio

An average freight train weighs over 5,500 tonnes. Compare that to a car, which weighs about 1.5 tonnes. A train hitting a car is like a car hitting a pop can.

5 Railway cars

Stopped railway cars can move at any time. If you're on one or near one when it moves, you could lose a limb - or worse, your

6 Tunnels and bridges

Tunnels, bridges, and trestles are designed only for trains. Trespassers can be seriously injured or killed.

7 Overhang

Trains can carry loads that are wider than the railroad cars themselves. They can have chains, straps or other equipment that may extend outside the car. If you are standing too close, you could get hit.

8 Any time is train time


Trains do not always run on schedule. They can run at any time, on any track and come from either direction.

Larry Armstrong: a true CN ambassador

Larry Armstrong loved the railroad. So much so that when he retired in 2001 from CN with over 40 years of service, he didn't hesitate to volunteer at the Elgin County Railroad Museum to stay connected.

Larry worked every Saturday for 7 years as a tour guide before his passing, generously sharing his knowledge of railroad operations and the railway history of St. Thomas, ON, where the museum is located. "Larry was all railroad. He knew so much, including little known facts about the railroad and was a natural storyteller," says his wife Cathy. "He made people laugh and they so loved his tours. They always wanted to leave him a tip but he always directed them to the museum's donation box."

The grant money the museum received for Larry's volunteer work from the CN Railroaders in the Community program was used to update its building and refurbish old equipment. "The improvements were good for the city because they helped attract tourists to the museum," says Cathy. Another bonus of Larry's volunteerism is that it motivated Cathy to get involved in museum activities alongside with him. "I love talking to people as he did and help out during the bingo games," she says. "We were partners together in the Railroaders in the Community program and were involved in CN tree planting ceremonies and other company activities. The railroad has been our favorite cause."

The C-11, C-7 Merger was effective on June 1/23.

Traditionally during the Christmas season the members of Council C-11 Sarnia made donations to various charities in Sarnia and Windsor.
